

An above-grade monument typically consists of a stone on top of a base, which rests on a concrete foundation. The limits for monument dimensions (measured at any point in a given dimension) is:

	Single monument	Double monument
<b>Stone:</b>		
Left-to-right (maximum)	2 feet, 0 inches	3 feet, 6 inches
Front-to-back (maximum)	0 feet, 8 inches	0 feet, 8 inches
Top-to-bottom (maximum)	2 feet, 6 inches	2 feet, 8 inches
<b>Base:</b>		
Left-to-right (maximum)	2 feet, 6 inches	4 feet, 6 inches
Front-to-back (maximum)	1 foot, 2 inches	1 foot, 2 inches
Top-to-bottom (maximum)	0 feet, 8 inches	0 feet, 8 inches
<b>Foundation:</b>		
Left-to-right (maximum)	2 feet, 6 inches	4 feet, 6 inches
Front-to-back (maximum)	matched to base	matched to base
Top-to-bottom (minimum)	2 feet, 6 inches	2 feet, 6 inches

The total top-to-bottom dimension of the stone mounted on the base may not exceed 3 feet, 2 inches for a single monument or 3 feet, 4 inches for a double monument. The foundation may not extend above ground level.
